Romania key figures:

2007 - accession in EU


22 million inhabitants

54% - Population served by water supply systems and waste water treatment plants

16% - Population served only by drinking water supply systems

30% - Population without public service

Negotiations opening chapter 22 - 21 March 2002


Informal consultation - July 2002 - March 2003

Finalization of the complementary position document – 1st part and official submitting to start the negotiations – June 2004


Closing of the 1st part of chapter 22 – Environment – with the approval of 5 proposed transition periods - 23 September 2004

Closing of the 2nd part of the chapter 22 – Environment – with the approval of 6 proposed transition periods – 26 November 2004

Wastewater treatment:

The Urban Wastewater Treatment Directive implementation requires investments of 9.5 billions Euro necessary to:


Implementation of measures:

- Construction of new urban waste water treatment plants;
- Up-grading of the existing urban waste water treatment plants;
- Up-grading of the existing waste water treatment plants in the agrofood industry;
- Rehabilitation of the existing urban sewerage collecting systems;
- Construction and/or extension of urban sewerage collecting systems.

Costs for Drinking Water Directive implementation:



County-wide monitoring of drinking water quality – new analytical equipment for 5 regional and 42 territorial laboratories of the MH	EUR 2.5 million	2004 - 2005
Investment in equipment for control monitoring performed by the producers	EUR 5.6 million	2004 - until the rehabilitation of the water treatment plants
Improvement of technologies and extension of the water treatment	EUR 2,000 million	2004 – 2015
Rehabilitation and extension of the water supply networks	EUR 3, 600 million	2004 - 2015
Replacement of the domestic distribution systems	Not estimated yet	2004 - 2015
TOTAL	EUR 5,608.1 million	2004-31.12.2015





Public Private Partnership

- on-going concession contracts: BUCURESTI, PLOIESTI
- under development : ARAD, CRAIOVA, CONSTANTA, TIMISOARA
- Total investment Value : about 200 mil. Euro



Small and Medium Towns Infrastructure Development (SAMTID)

14 Association of Municipalities (aprox. 80 towns)

- total investments value: 140 mil.Euro
- pilot phase: started in 2004
- counties: Alba, Calarasi, Botosani, Cluj-Salaj, Hunedoara
- investment costs: 40 mil. Euro

Consolidation phase:

- started in 2005
- investments costs : aprox. 100 mil.euro



ISPA & Cohesion Funds


- ISPA

 - 5 projects


Cohesion Funds
