BACKGROUND

The Volta Basin

- shared by 6 riparian countries Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Benin, Togo, Mali and Ghana
- remains one of the few transboundary river basins in Africa without formal legal and institutional arrangements for managing its water resources
- Ghana and Burkina occupy about 84% of the basin, remaining 16% shared amongst the other 4 countries
- Ghana and Burkina thus hold the key to establishing the Basin Organization
- 45% of the land mass of Togo lies in the Oti arm of the Volta basin; contributes significantly to the inflow to the Volta Lake

STEPS TAKEN

Accra Declaration

- 21 September 1999 Accra: Meeting of experts of riparian countries; declared implementation of Integrated Management of Water and Land Resources of the Volta basin; and to take steps to form a Basin Authority

- July 08 to 11 2002: Workshop on IWRM also in Accra, by SISCOA; recommended formation of a Volta Basin Technical Committee (VBTC) to guide the process towards establishing a Volta Basin Organization to manage the resources of the Volta basin.
- August 2002, Green Cross International Workshop in Accra; led to a Volta Basin Declaration proposing a set of key principles for the peaceful management of conflicts related to the shared water resources of the Volta River.
- April 2004, Accra: Joint meeting of Ministers in for water in Ghana and Burkina Faso; Declared readiness to efficient management of the water and land resources of the two countries through an MoU

In furtherance of the above,

- An expert meeting of the 6 riparian countries met in Ouagadougou, 29-30 July 2004, and resolved to establish a Volta Basin Technical Committee (VBTC)
- VBTC is a consultative committee to perform activities including but not limited to the following:

-Identifying all the issues and obstacles in the establishment of a Volta basin body;

-Collecting, pooling and exchanging all relevant information;

-Advising national authorities; and

-Directing partner support for the setting up of the basin body.

STATUTES

At the Ouaga meeting, the statutes of the VBTC were adopted. Some of the highlights are:

- Official working languages shall be French and English.
- VBTC is to guide the process towards the establishment of a Volta basin organization

Structure:

The VBTC shall consist of the following:

- Expert Committee
- Coordination

Expert Committee -

two representatives; the National Focal Point and one other expert

Coordination-

vested in the President and his Vice, and a Secretariat.

- The VBTC shall hold its ordinary meetings twice a year. The chairperson shall convene such meetings.
- Extraordinary meetings of the VBTC can be held at the request of, at least, two-thirds of the member countries.

WHERE WE ARE

- VBTC has been formed awaiting ministerial approval
- National Focal Points have been identified by virtue of appropriate section of the Statutes
- Coordination of the activities has been invested in the President, Vice President and the Secretariat. (The Presidency is held by Burkina Faso with Ghana as the Vice)

NEXT STEPS

- Meeting of Ministers for Water Resources to formally endorse the establishment of VBTC
- Preceding the ministerial meeting, should be the 1st Session of VBTC
- Prepare Action Plan for the VBTC

CONCLUSIONS

- Though awaiting ministerial approval, VBTC has come to stay and is affirmation of the resolve of the riparian countries of the Volta basin to come together to establish a permanent body to effectively manage the water and land resources in an integrated and sustainable manner
- Recognizing the fact that such an endeavor would require both financial and human resources, the VBTC would mobilize the needed resources through partnership with institutions such as INBO/ANBO, EU, GEF and other UN agencies and donors
- Finally, with this presentation it is hoped that the VBTC will be admitted to membership of the Network of Basin Organizations
